Morning Nutrition Programme Launched for Tribal Children in Birbhum, West Bengal

On 7th June 2025, Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust, in collaboration with Vidya Jyoti UK, inaugurated the Morning Nutrition Programme in Birbhum district, West Bengal marking a pivotal step in addressing childhood hunger among tribal communities.

This initiative, introduced across 10 study centres operated by the Nayantara Memorial Charitable Trust, aims to benefit 700 tribal children with daily servings of SaiSure Ragi Multi-Nutrient Health Mix fortified with jaggery. This vital nourishment is designed to support growth, enhance immunity, and bridge nutritional gaps during formative years.

Vidya Jyoti UK, led by Founder and Trustee Dr Pamela Kaushal, generously funded the programme. The organisation is known for its global humanitarian footprint, spanning clean water access in Africa, medical sponsorships, and local welfare programmes in the UK. The collaboration was further supported by Vishal Bhardwaj, Sandeep Majumdar, and Sudip Majumdar.

Trustee and Chief Development Officer Mr Ashish Bhardwaj, representing Annapoorna Trust, expressed deep gratitude for the partnership. The Trust affirmed its ongoing commitment to eliminate classroom hunger and empower underserved children through sustained nutritional support.

Nourishing Young Lives Across Tamil Nadu: A Continued Commitment in 2024–25



The year 2024–25 witnessed Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust continuing its dedicated service across Tamil Nadu, delivering daily morning nutrition to thousands of schoolchildren. With the steadfast support of CSR partners and philanthropic foundations, the Trust's mission to end classroom hunger has gained greater momentum.

Operating through diverse models tailored to regional needs, the Morning Nutrition Programme currently supports over 4,000 children across districts like Chennai, Tuticorin, Kodaikanal, Kanyakumari, Tenkasi, and Krishnagiri. In Chennai, the initiative powered by the Danirasa Foundation provides freshly cooked breakfasts from a centralised kitchen to 1,890 students. Meanwhile, in other districts, children receive SaiSure Ragi Multi-Nutrient Health Mix with jaggery, designed to address both macro- and micronutrient deficiencies.

These efforts are further strengthened by the support of Sodexo, whose global nutrition expertise has enabled impactful implementation in Hosur and Tenkasi. Strong collaboration with government departments and educational institutions continues to drive scale and sustainability.

Annapoorna Trust remains unwavering in its vision: "Let no child go to school hungry." The Tamil Nadu chapter is a shining example of how compassion, science, and partnership can together nurture brighter, healthier futures - one nutritious meal and one school at a time.

On 27th June 2025, Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust hosted a landmark CSR conclave at Hilton Bengaluru, commemorating ten years of impactful service in the field of child nutrition. On 18th June 2025, a meaningful collaboration between Trelleborg, a global engineering group headquartered in Sweden, and Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust marked a significant step forward in promoting education through nutrition.

Representatives from Trelleborg — Ms Bindu Vishwanath (Director, HR), Ms Lakshmi Tulasi (Asst Manager, HR & Admin), and Ms Sujatha from the Prosocial sector visited the Trust's headquarters at Sathya Sai Grama. The visit culminated in the ceremonial handover of a dedicated Ashok Leyland Light Commercial Vehicle, donated to support the Trust's rural morning nutrition delivery efforts.

The delegation also toured the SaiSure Nutraceutical Facility to understand how the Trust prepares its scientifically formulated health supplements fortified SaiSure Ragi and Malt that are served to over 1 crore children across 25 states and 4 Union Territories.

Trelleborg's leadership was deeply moved by the far-reaching impact of the Morning Nutrition Programme, which not only addresses hunger and hidden hunger, but also improves academic outcomes and school attendance. A shared vision of nourishing education emerged, with discussions around Trelleborg adopting schools in specific regions. Together, this partnership affirms a simple yet powerful truth: good nutrition is the foundation of great learning.
